**DEAD SEA SCROLL EXHIBIT – SCIENCE MUSEUM OF MN– SUNDAY JULY 18 –**

Don't miss this unique opportunity to see this most important archaeological discovery. They tell a story beyond time and our imaginations about the world 2,000 years ago. More than 100,000 scroll fragments have been pieced together into over 900 documents – from biblical commentary to religious writings. ## *Anita Hill*      *Co-Pastor Commentary*      *Keith Olstad*

*You shall raise up the foundations of many generations; you shall be called the repairer of the breach, restorers of streets to live in. Isaiah 58:12b*

St. Paul-Reformation's Isaiah Core Team is working with what may be the biggest project since I-94 was built in Saint Paul. \$1 Billion is being invested in the Central Corridor Light Rail Transit construction. Some St. Paul-Reformation members are already experiencing the disruption of streets and access in downtown Saint Paul as the first work on the light rail is already underway in Lowertown. By June 2011, the rezoning of University Avenue will be completed, which will change our metroscape for the next hundred years. An additional \$2 Billion is expected in investments and construction of businesses and housing along the Central Corridor in the next five-seven years.

Why does this matter to St. Paul-Ref members? It's about the Christian mandate to care for our neighbors. First, our church is located in the Central Corridor, which extends to Summit Avenue as the South border and to Pearce Butler on the North. Changes on University Avenue and the corridor will affect our church's neighbors, church members who live in the area, and will bring a changing demographic within our congregation's service area and our congregation's growth and viability in the decades to come.

Secondly, our congregation has been working since the 1950s to bring about justice in the realm of racial and economic justice. From my perspective, securing livable wage jobs for inner city residents is the primary step toward sustainability of individuals, families, and communities. Stable work and wages are key predictors of health.

What's in it for you? The opportunity to expand your base of relationships among St. Paul-Reformation members and neighbors, as well as elected and city, county, and metro officials. The chance to experience the strengths of faith based community organizing. The knowledge that you are making a legacy of justice-making. The certainty that you've worked on a project worth your investment. The chance to deepen your spirit and connection with God through prayer in action.

*"Let anyone with ears listen!"* -- Matthew 13:9  
NRSV

Twenty five times in the four gospels, Jesus urges people to listen to what he is saying, and another dozen or more times he urges people to listen to each other. Somewhere to the power of five, it is even more important that God's people hear. Hearing Jesus' words, hearing what God is saying, hearing each other seems to be a particular preoccupation in the gospels. Yet in our day, it seems to me, listening—truly listening deeply—to one another is a rare skill, practiced even more rarely still.

And yet to be heard—to be listened to thoroughly and well—can be one of the most profound experiences one person can have with another. Accordingly, to listen so carefully, so tenderly, that another person actually experiences being *heard* is a gift of spirit, a holy experience. To be heard can be literally healing, can be restorative and renewing both to spirit and to body.

God, it seems, is good at listening. God listens intently to what is deepest and most important within us. Jesus promises that whenever we call on God, God listens, and responds. (See Matthew 7:7-8, for example.)

Not surprisingly, God has equipped us to do the same. We have God-given ears, and we have hearts that can be deeply moved by what we hear. Insofar as we are called to listen, to hear each other in ways that reassure us that we are indeed *heard*, we participate with God in a holy activity, a restorative, healing work.

We are a congregation known for our passion for social justice, for our walking with people through trial and challenge, and we are admired and appreciated for this holy work. We will continue to do good work, I suspect, primarily to the degree that we continue to develop our capacities for listening. We will best serve God and neighbor to the degree that we listen deeply and well to each other and to our neighbors. This will be the best possible way to ensure that each and every one of us is also deeply heard.

## **EL SALVADOR UPDATE**

Sandy Iverson visited our sister parish, Christ the Liberator, in June. Lots of changes have taken place just since our last visit in February of this year. The walls are now going up! Where the foundation was laid there is now a wall about 2 feet high. Also a trench has now been dug along side of the road, which leads to the church. Families whose children received scholarships are each donating a day of work for this project. Soon a water pipe will be installed and the church will have access to water!

I delivered letters to our students on Sunday, June 14<sup>th</sup>. About half of the children were in church and were very pleased to get their letter and photograph. Many have written letters to their sponsors and wanted to know when their sponsor was coming to visit.

The micro loan program is moving along. The participants have had their first training in business management and two more trainings are planned before the money is disbursed.

We are excited about the possibility of Pastor Conchi visiting us either this fall or next spring. We will be starting the necessary paperwork so that she can get a visa.

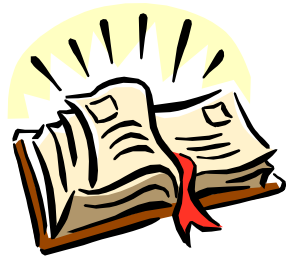

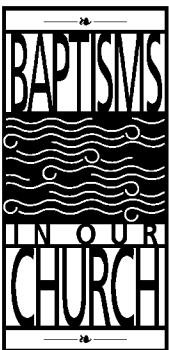
